


MEDICAID OVERVIEW

Medicaid is a joint federal and state program covering individuals with incomes below the federal poverty line and those with disabilities. It is the largest health insurer in the U.S covering 7.2 million seniors + 4.8 million with disabilities. Medicaid plans are state specific.


