## Pearls

- Involve all individuals in the experience
- Provide opportunities for the student to utilize resources

- Transition of care management from acute care to the home environment

## Pitfalls

- Logistically challenging
- Locating appropriate setting for debriefing
- Assessing the client's living environment in respect to sanitation, utilities and safety
- Non-traditional schedule

Ample time to develop a meaningful rapport with the client & family Individualization of end-of-planning needs such as MOLST, DNR, HCP
